

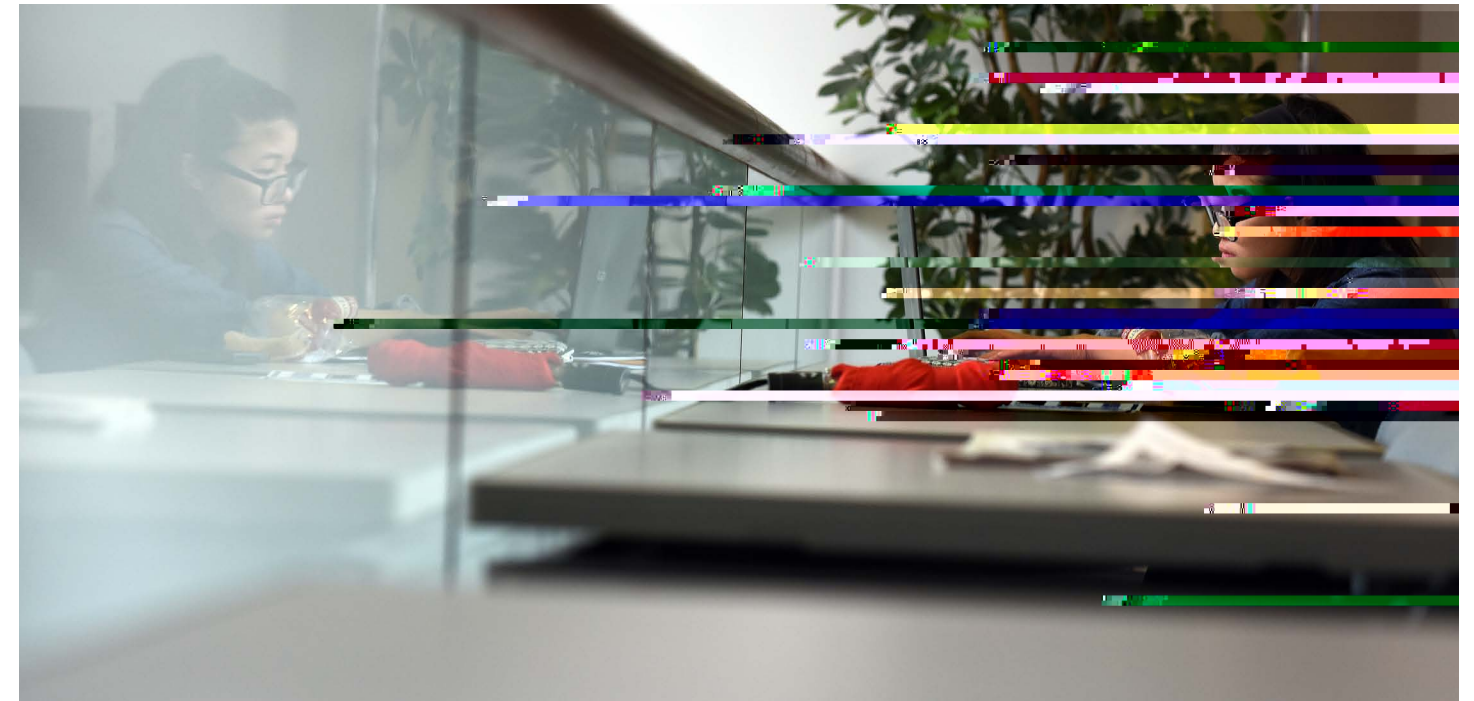

helps all students succeed in science courses and labs by emphasizing and teaching essential mathematical, graphing and laboratory skills.

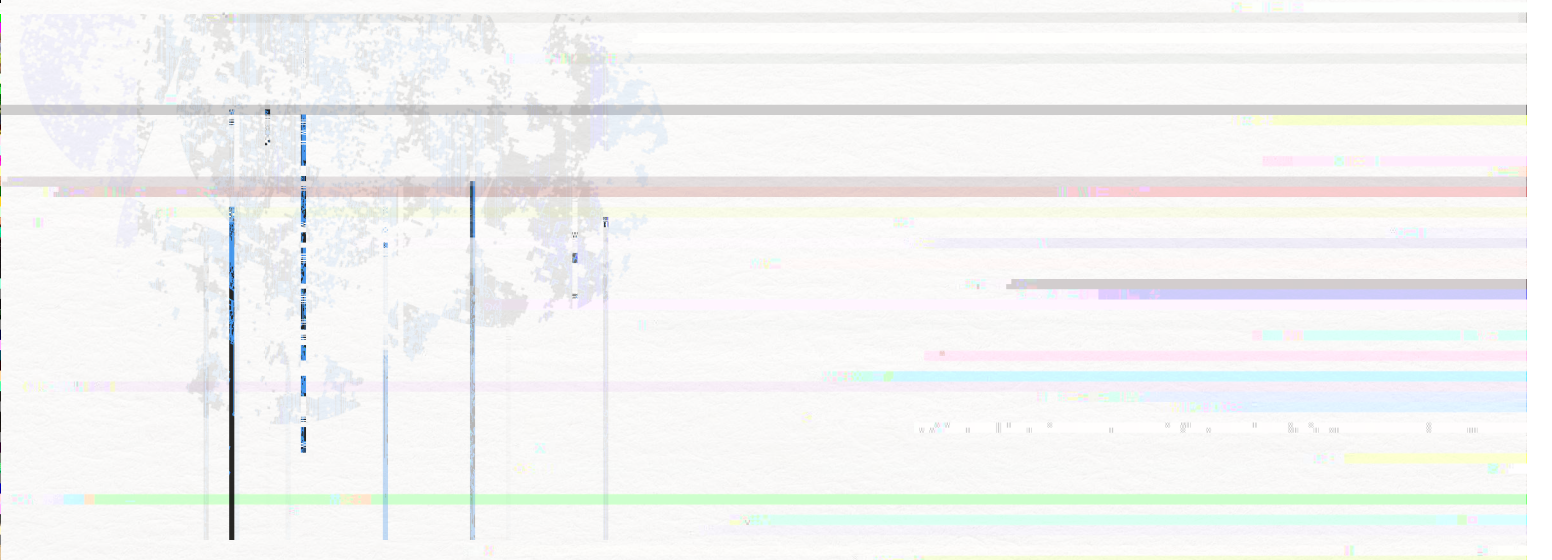
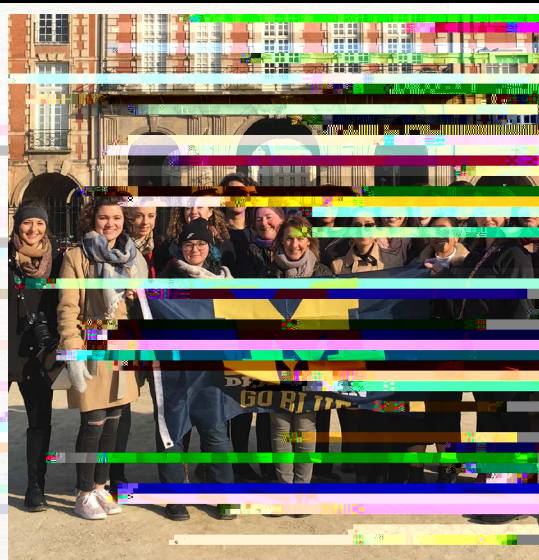
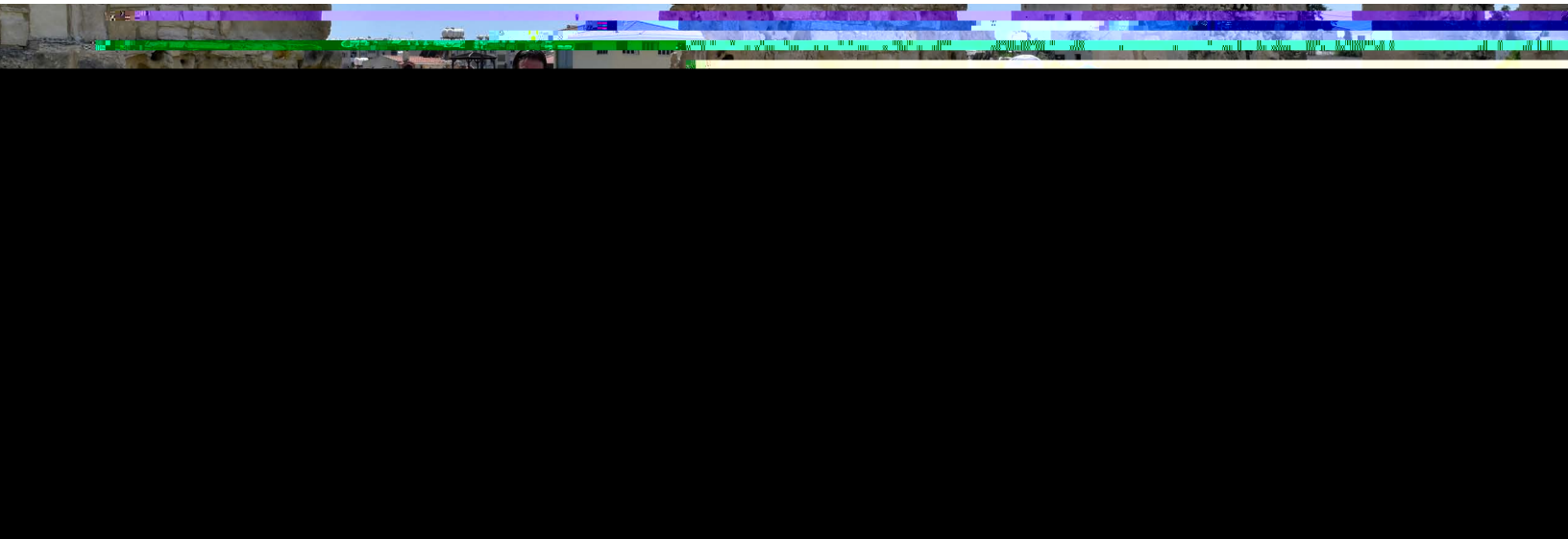
