

eCities 2023 Summary iLabs, Office of Engagement and Impact College of Business University of Michigan-Dearborn

eCities is an annual research study that examines community-level factors that foster entrepreneurship and small business development. The focus is on entrepreneurship and small business growth because of their importance to the expansion and diversification of regional economies and job creation. Data Sources

In 2023, five-year's worth of publicly available data on communities was collected by the eCities team to analyze trends surrounding business and economic cycles. Such data demonstrates growth, investments, and the cost of doing business within the communities.

More specifically, eCities examined eleven publicly available data points relating to community growth and investment metrics that impact the business community. Data was collected on 277 Michigan communities from 54 of the 83 counties in the state. Communities were chosen based on population, geography, and relative size within counties.

Property Values (7 data points): Examines the changes in the amount of real commercial property, real industrial property, real total property, personal commercial property, personal industrial property, total personal property, and overall total property

Property Taxes (1 data point): Examines the changes in the average non-homestead tax rate

Governmental Assets (3 data points): Examines the changes in non-depreciated, depreciated, and total governmental assets

In addition to the quantitative data collection and analysis, all communities were invited to respond to a short-answer survey regarding business climate improvement efforts and small business support. More specifically, community leaders were asked to respond to the following statements:
